Dear Siblings in Christ,

Our new bishop, Rev. Christopher deForest, has established a plan for the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod. Many of you are familiar with Bp. deForest, as he served St. John's for the better part of a decade. This plan, led by the Holy Spirit, is meant to bring our synod into the future as we wonder about God's work here and now. The synod-wide plan encourages congregations to wonder about their vital signs, what are we doing well? As I have been reflecting on this initiative, I can't help but think about all the ways **we are already serving God's people.**

As a congregation, we hosted an outdoor Christmas Eve (moved to 12/26/20 due to rain) service, where we hosted the community, as well as Trinity Lutheran Church, Lehighton, for Christmas Carols, hot cocoa, God's Word, and of course, God's love. We were excited about the feedback we received from our event, so we decided to hold an outdoor Easter event in conjunction with our Egg Hunt. We welcomed members of the community, some whom we've never met, and showed them God's love made manifest in the miracle of Easter. The food that was left from our event was donated to people experiencing homelessness near the Canal in Weissport, which is a subtle, but real way that God's love reaches out from our church community.

God's love is shown through the people of St. John's on Sunday mornings when we proclaim Christ crucified and risen. It's made manifest in our singing of praises and our preaching of God's Word. God's love radiates out from St. John's through our social media presence and our website. We've made digital contact and ministered to people who we may never see walk through the doors of our church, but nonetheless they've received the message of God's love. This can be difficult for us because we want all people to experience the welcome and home feeling that St. John's gives us, but God's Kin_dom is SO, SO much bigger than the structure in which we worship.

The bishop's plan also calls us to discern what must change. In her book *Maybe You Should Talk to Someone* Lori Gottleib writes, "We can't have change without loss, which is why so often people say they want change but nonetheless stay exactly the same." Change causes grief, and grief is something we try to avoid. Sometimes we also want everything to change all at once, for us to already be where we're going, but that's not how sustainable change happens. Later in her book Gottleib writes, "Most big transformations come about from the hundreds of tiny, almost imperceptible, steps we take along the way." *Change is hard* is a phrase we hear inside and outside the church because it is a reality of being human, but that doesn't mean we can't change. We can change, little by little, until we reflect God's Kin_dom here on earth in Lehighton, in the valley, and beyond.


I encourage you to consider the work we're doing, but I also employ you to consider the ways we fall short – to wonder about what changes God might be calling us to make and also what things God might be calling for us to let go, to let die. As Christians, we are a people that understand that death must come before resurrection... that doesn't make it easy, but we know it's worth it! We will continue to wonder about what vital signs we already possess, and we'll wonder about what might need to change or die in order for us to move forward.

Be well as we continue our Easter journey to Pentecost!





SYNOD NEWS

NORTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA SYNOD, ELCA

Our Synod is trying something new – and we need you! As many of you will know, our 2021 Synod Assembly (SA21) was scheduled to be at the Kalahari Resort in the Poconos. COVID canceled that plan. Our Synod Assembly for this year is to be virtual once again and is scheduled for June 4 & 5.



Our theme for SA21 is "Growing Young and Vital.

It will showcase our commitment to the nation-wide church renewal program called "Growing Young". It will also introduce our three-pronged Synod-wide emphasis on the "Vital Signs," signs of life and thriving among us. These Vital Signs are: Loving the Land, Healing the Hurt, and Engaging the Stranger. Our goal was to invite many churches and ministries in the Synod to participate by bringing your ministries in the three areas to display at the Kalahari Resort. So, what to do, now that SA21 is virtual?

Introducing NEPA Ministry Lab 2021! (MinLab for short.) MinLab is your opportunity to spotlight how your churches or organization's ministries are already showing evidence of these Vital Signs. Where is your congregation shining as a "Jesus-Centered Community" (Growing Young)? Think of this day exactly as the name implies: a ministry laboratory. 1.) we give you a display area. You showcase your ministry in that space exactly how you choose. It is up to your creativity. 2.) this is your opportunity to mingle with others doing ministries like yours. And, 3.) perhaps most importantly, be inspired by others doing ministry around one of the other vital signs.

We will hold the event mainly outdoors at the Lutheran Center in Allentown – our Synod headquarters – on August 14, 2021 from 10:00AM to 3:00PM. More details about exactly when and how to participate will be coming soon. **This is where you come in!** How can your churches or organization's ministries help all of us in our synod to see the signs of life among us?

This is your opportunity to proclaim to all the signs of life that are active in your local community. To inspire others to partner with you, or to start a ministry of their own. To show the rest of us how it works, right where you are planted. There will be lots of fun and excitement on full display. We will use as much of the Lutheran Center's parking lot and property as we can to accommodate all who

A big Thank You to everyone who helped with our Rummage Sale. We pulled together and pulled this off. There were lots of positive comments and lots of sales made.


Our total for the two days was \$1,617.92!
